At Olivia's House: A Grief and Loss Center for Children our goal is not to "fix" a family's grief. We instead work diligently to create a safe space where children can process and embrace feelings of profound loss. When working with children, however, they are often unsure how to begin processing these complex emotions. Unfortunately, there isn't a magic formula for bereavement, but having companioned countless children over the past 20 plus years we have gained some valuable insights, or as we refer to it, the *Playbook of Grief.* So where do we start?

"Did your person have a favorite football team?" This simple question always has an answer (even if the answer is no, there is usually a good story!), but more importantly it is the doorway for building non-threatening emotional engagement. Memories week of our Hearts Can Heal program is never complete without a child bringing in their loved one's favorite jersey, often one of their most treasured keepsakes. It is our privilege to be on the sidelines cheering for the children and families in Central Pennsylvania and Northern Maryland as they leave it all on the field and work through their pain after loss. This is only possible because our community is more than a team that simply works together, we are a team that cares for each other.

As a free-standing, independent grief and loss center, Olivia's House relies entirely upon our philanthropic community to keep our doors open. No family pays a penny for the quality services and care they receive at Olivia's House. 

Our total income for the fiscal year 2024 was \$611,999.86 as compared to our total expenditures of \$498,220.65. This activity left us with a net gain of \$113,779.21.



We were honored to work with program alumni, Barry and Heidi Mease of BLM Construction to not only update the space but also provide a design that will supplement the growth of our programs (especially the adult group) for years to come. While the funds were received in fiscal year 2024, the majority will be expensed in fiscal year 2025

Program Alumni and "Guardian Angels" of the M&M Lissauer Foundation surprised Olivia's House by making a wonderful endowment gift. Honoring his late wife's legacy as a teacher, this gift served as seed funding to develop our very own podcast, "Guess Who Died?!" as well as provide for an annual educational staff retreat.

This sizable surplus also resulted largely from gains realized on our investment accounts, memorial donations, and grant writing.

Our Board of Directors remains deliberate in their fiscal responsibility. In addition, we continue to be blessed by a philanthropic community that generously provides for and partners with our mission to make healing possible for children and their families!
